Stabbing Investigation

On Saturday 11/2/24 at 12:40 AM, DeKalb Police responded to 829 Greenbrier Road for the report of someone who had been stabbed. Upon arrival, police officers located the victim who had numerous stab wounds to the torso and extremities. She was transported by ambulance to Kishwaukee Hospital and was then flown to a hospital in Rockford, where she remains in critical but stable condition. She is expected to recover from her injuries.

The suspect in this case, Edgar S. Perkins (M/B/44 YOA), voluntarily surrendered himself to a NIU police officer shortly after the incident. Perkins had been married to the victim, but they had been separated for an extended period of time.

Perkins has been charged with the following offenses, and is currently lodged at the DeKalb County Jail:

- Attempted Murder (Class X Felony)
- Aggravated Domestic Battery (Class 2 Felony)
- Aggravated Battery with Deadly Weapon (Class 3 Felony)

More charges are possible against Perkins as police continue to investigate the incident.

While the survivor in this case had no way to know about the impending attack against her, domestic violence appears in many forms and sometimes people feel there is little they can do to improve their situation. Everyone has the right to feel safe in their own home.
