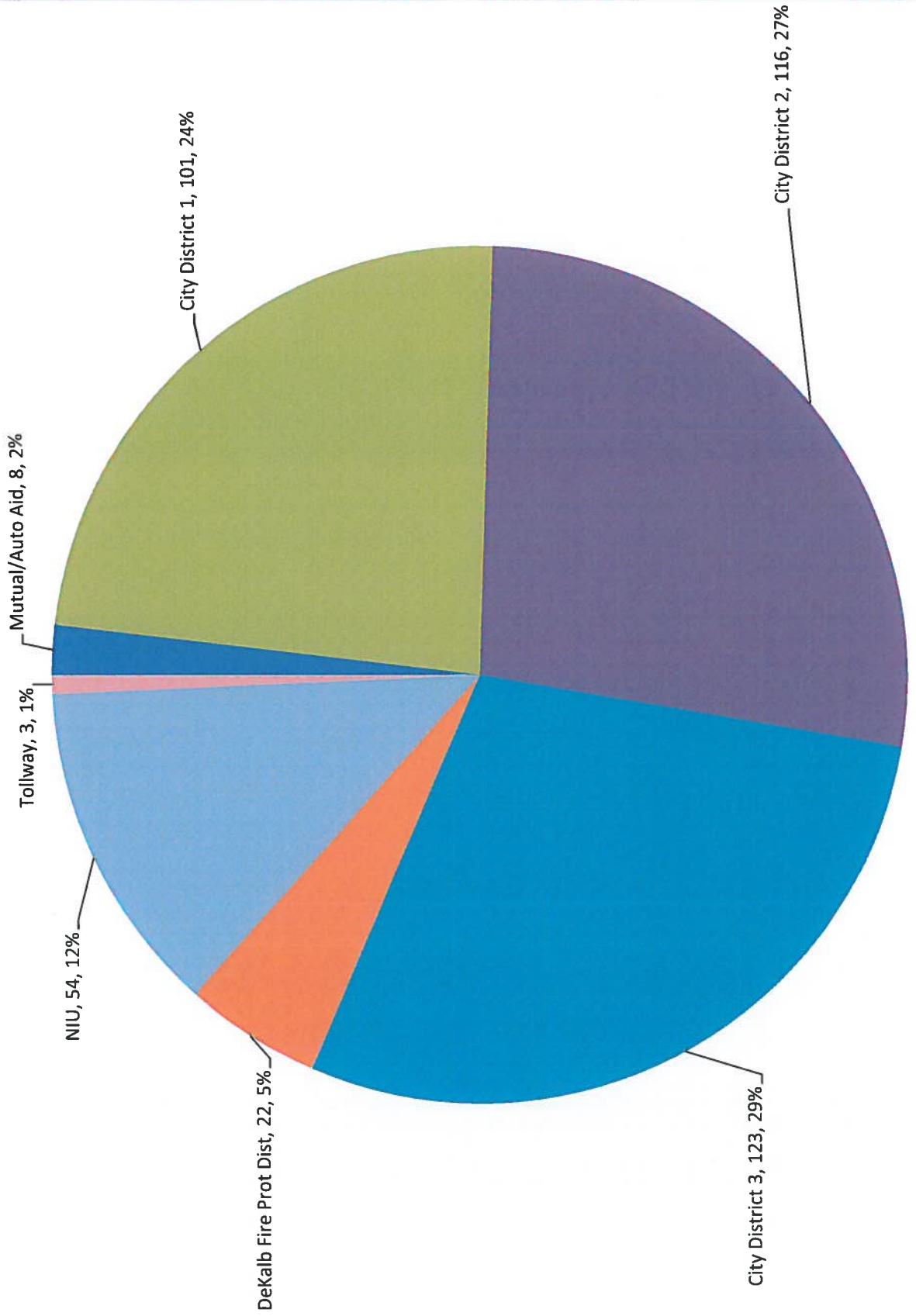

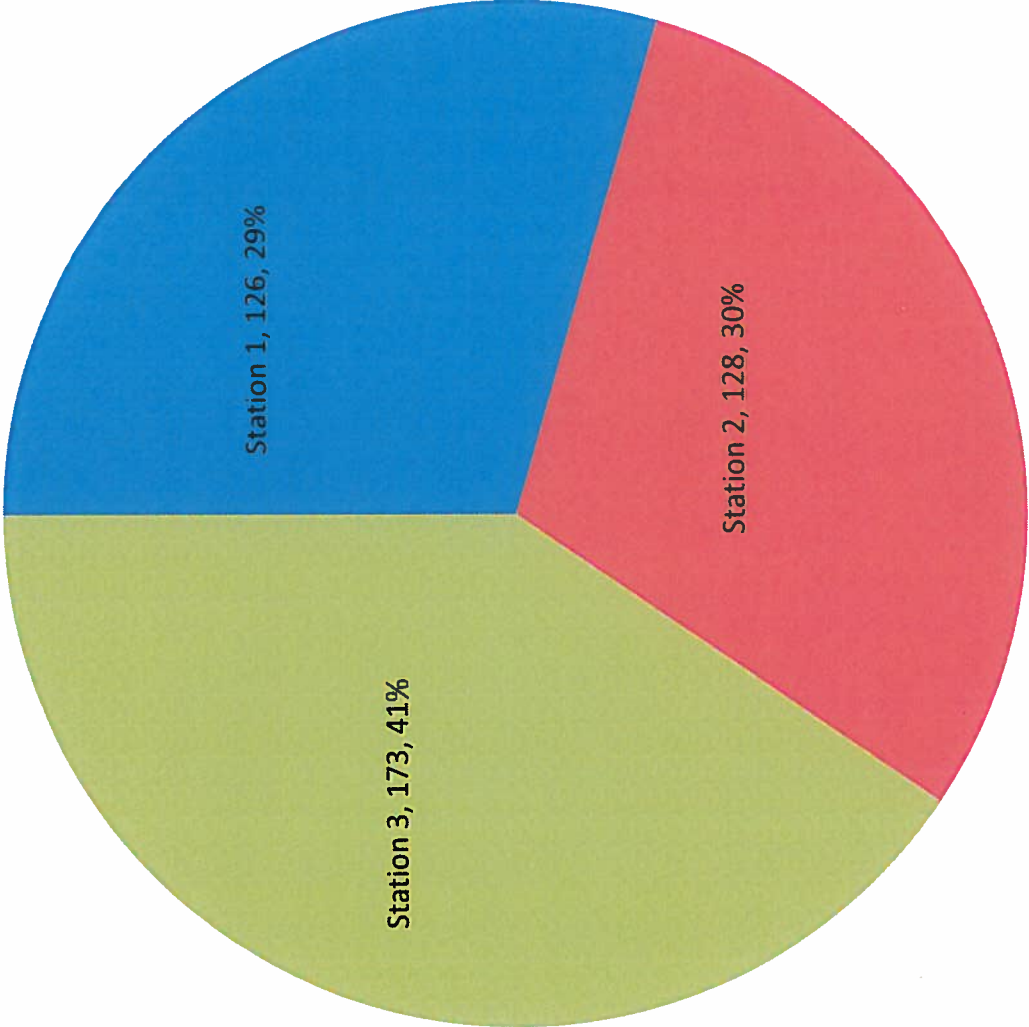


**Calls By Incident Type Category**

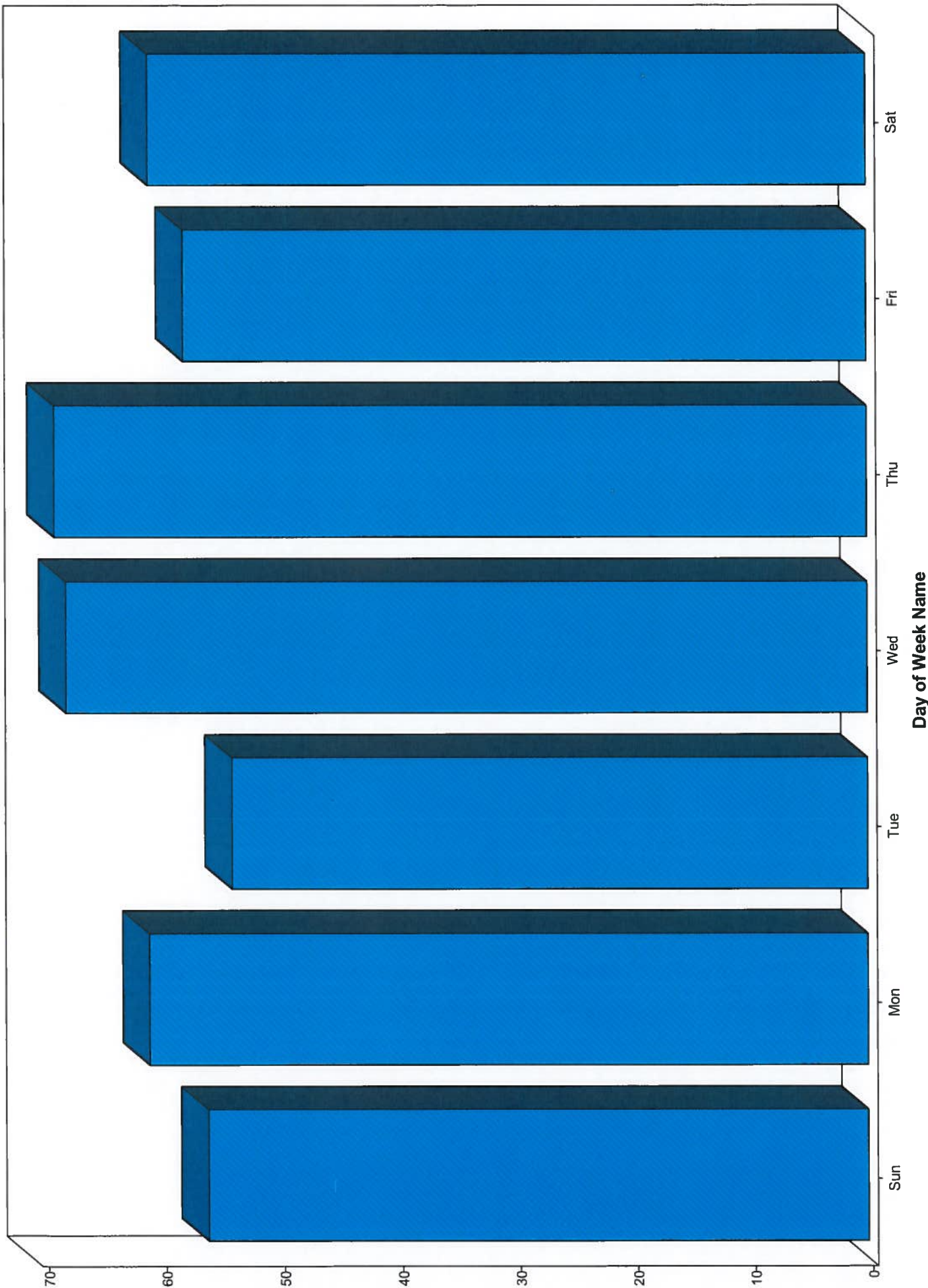

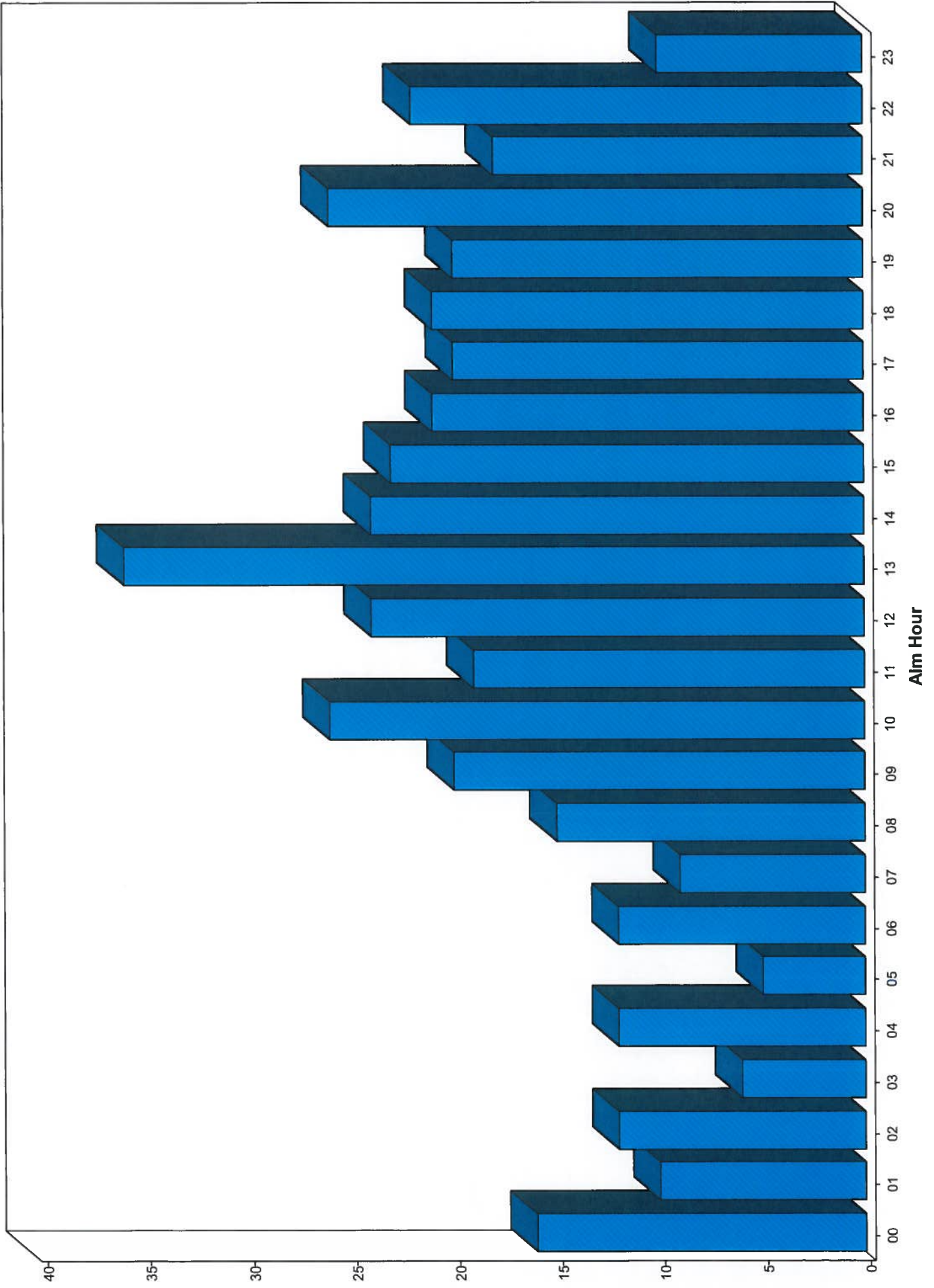




Incident Responses by Day of Week
